



Tell: sem a preposição “to”. Transmissão de informações específicas a uma ou mais pessoas. Geralmente, há um destinatário claro da informação.
Exemplo: "Can you tell me the time, please?"

Talk: comunicação informal e à troca de informações em uma conversa ou discussão.
Exemplo: "We like to talk about our weekend plans."

Say: uso da preposição “to”. Mais amplo, se refere ao ato de expressar pensamentos com ou sem destinatário.
Exemplo: "She didn't say a word during the meeting."

Speak: Línguas (speak English). Mais formal, usado em contextos públicos ou profissionais.
Exemplo: " She is speaking to her boss right now."
