

## Will

Se você decide algo no **momento da conversa**, deverá usar WILL.




"I will close the window".

A pessoa decidiu fechar a janela naquele momento.

That's a great idea. I will invite lots of people.



Let's have a party?



Sometimes the difference between will and going to is very small:

John will meet us in the restaurant at 8 o'clock.

Or

John's **going to** meet us in the restaurant at 8 o'clock.

Sometimes the difference between will and going to is very small:

Will you come back this evening?

Or

**Are you going to** come back this evening?

### Will

FORMAL AND WRITTEN ENGLISH

WILL with expressions such as: "I THINK", "MAYBE".
